1. **CHANGES IN THE DIOCESAN PASTORAL CENTRE:

For the last few years, the diocese has incurred large operating deficits, due mainly to significantly-reduced income from investments. These losses are unsustainable and led the Diocesan Finance Council and College of Consultors, a group of priests that advises the bishop, to closely examine the cost of operating the Diocesan Pastoral Centre.

This process led to the decision to discontinue the position of Director of Evangelization and Catechesis, which has been shared by Fr. Jack Michalchuk and Mr. John Connelly, effective at the end of June.

There is no question of turning away from our responsibility to evangelize and catechize in service of the Church's mission. Instead, we need to adopt new ways to continue the work. To that end, the bishop will establish a commission of clergy and lay leaders from parishes and schools to coordinate and promote initiatives in evangelization and catechesis in parishes and schools. This will be similar to the Liturgy and Stewardship Commissions which have already begun to serve the diocese.

Our thanks go to Fr. Michalchuk and Mr. Connelly for their fruitful labours, as we continue efforts to help our parishes become more effective as evangelizing communities.

2. LEADERSHIP CHANGE AT IMMACULATE CONCEPTION AND ST. MARY'S CATHOLIC SCHOOLS IN PRINCE GEORGE:

For the past 13 years, Immaculate Conception and St. Mary's Schools have been blessed with the outstanding Catholic leadership of Donncha O'Callaghan and Brent Arsenault. Collectively, their faith and witness have been an inspiration to students, staff, parents, and parish communities. They have developed lead schools that provide dynamic, relevant, and faith-filled education.

Mr. O'Callaghan and Mr. Arsenault have prayerfully discerned a change in their career. This leaves a vacancy in both schools for a principal.

Mr. Arsenault and his family are moving away and Mr. O'Callaghan is returning to the classroom at Immaculate Conception.

In my twenty-six years of education, I can confidently and proudly say that these two principals are among the very best Catholic Principals in the province. Our schools, communities and Diocese have been served by these pillars in an exemplary manner. I am most grateful for their "yes" and commitment to Catholic education and hope we can collectively express our gratitude to them as they prepare for this change in their careers.
