CHABC Strategic Plan Takes Shape

The CHABC is making the Education component of its new Mission Statement a reality. It has launched its first PASTORAL CARE OUTREACH PROGRAM!

This program is designed to give parishioners who wish to start up a parish-based pastoral visitation program the tools to understand how to work with and support the individuals and families who, for reasons of health or frailty, are isolated in their homes or residential care facilities.

On April 28th, at Our Lady of Fatima Parish, Coquitlam, Bob Breen launched the First Session of the Training Program, entitled *The Healing Ministry of Christ*, the first in a four-part series. Ms. Moira King, Chairperson of the Victoria Diocesan Health Committee, was present to introduce the series along with Rev. William Hann, Pastor of Holy Cross Parish, Victoria. Both have had considerable experience in presenting this program on the Island.

The Second Session of the Training Program, *Listening and Communication & Mental Health*, will be held Saturday, June 23rd, in the same location—Our Lady of Fatima Parish, Coquitlam. No dates have yet been set for the further two sessions, but they will be announced in due course on the CHABC website: They are entitled: Session 3: *The Grieving Process and Ministering to Families*, and Session 4: *Who am I as a Pastoral Visitor?*

WORLD DAY OF THE SICK 2018

In honour of the 26th annual WORLD DAY OF THE SICK, Archbishop Michael Miller, CSB, celebrated a Mass of the Anointing at Our Lady of Sorrows Parish, February 13th.

Concelebrating with him, and assisting in conferring the Sacrament, were Monsignor Bernard Rossi, PH, Episcopal Vicar for Health Care, Father Richard Zanotti, CS, Pastor of Our Lady of Sorrows Parish, and several other priests from around the Archdiocese. There were more than 350 people present, including sick, elderly, and their attendants.

Afterwards, Archbishop Miller and the other clergy visited with many of the congregation at a reception prepared by the ladies of the parish in the school gym.

The <u>theme of the World Day of the Sick</u> this year was: "Woman, behold your son … Behold your mother. And from that hour the disciple took her into his home" (Jn 19:26-27).

In his homily, Archbishop Miller touched on the mystery of the Cross, expressing deep gratitude to all caregivers, thanking them for their compassion, their "suffering with" those entrusted to their care—the sick and elderly.

He pointed to those who accompanied Jesus in his suffering and were present at the foot of the Cross, including Mary and the beloved disciple John: "While less a physical suffering, theirs was a profound spiritual suffering...Likewise, the suffering of the caregiver—which is true compassion—always plays a vital role in building up the Body of Christ."



The Archbishop then exhorted the sick and elderly present to face their infirmities with faith in God, in his love and goodness, saying, "This is the real answer which radically defeats the evil of sickness and suffering and turns them into means of being united with Jesus in his work of salvation."
