Nestled on the beautiful shores of Stuart Lake, Camp Morice is a Catholic Camp servicing the Northern BC Community with summer camp programs and conference services. Camp Morice is dedicated to teaching children and youth good morals based on the Catholic Church's teachings. Camp Morice promotes individualism and team work to form a well rounded individual. Facilities include the Holy Family Chapel, a gathering hall, soccer field, seven comfortable cabins, and a kilometer of beach along beautiful Stuart Lake. It boasts of breathtaking sunsets, lots of space, beautiful scenery, and great swimming. For groups and retreats, Camp Morice offers secluded wilderness, beautiful weather, and an overwhelming feeling of peace. Both a meeting hall that can seat 75 people and a semi-commercial kitchen are available if needed.

Camp Information

Camps begin with registration between 3:00 and 4:00 on the first day of camp. They end with a final mass at 11am in the morning on the last day of camp. Parents are welcome to join us, and can leave with campers right after mass.

Recreational vehicles are welcome for Cana Camps but please contact Camp Morice in advance. No hook ups are available or can be provided.
