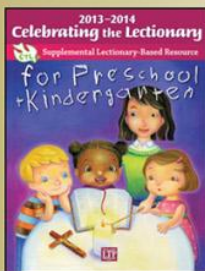


# New! Celebrating the Lectionary Series 2013 - 2014
