Joanne Chafe Memorial Bursary Application Requirements

- Applicants must be actively pursuing studies aimed at catechetical ministry at either the parish or diocesan level in western or northern Canada.
- Applicants must submit a minimum of three (3) reference letters, one of which must be the applicant's
 current parish priest and one of which must be from an individual who knows the person's involvement in
 catechetical ministry.
- The intent is to offer the bursary annually; however, the financial means of the WCCRE will determine the availability of the bursary beyond 2012. A new application must be made each year that the bursary is available.
- All else being equal, the bursary will be awarded to those who most need financial assistance.
- As part of the discernment process, the WCCRE bursary committee members may choose to interview applicants in person or by telephone before a final bursary is awarded.
- With advance written notice, the WCCRE may withhold or withdraw support from those applicants enrolled in ongoing programs where qualifications or situations may have changed.
- 7. Incomplete and inaccurate information provided by an applicant will result in denial of the application. These requirements are subject to change without notice. All information provided by applicants will be held in strict confidence and used only to determine award of the bursary.

Western Conference of Catholic Religious Educators (WCCRE)

The Western Conference of Catholic Religious Educators was founded in 1968 and seeks to ensure inter-diocesan and inter-eparchial cooperation in catechesis and evangelization. The WCCRE provides a forum for sharing the efforts of all catechists in western and northern Canada: in British Columbia, Alberta, Saskatchewan, Manitoba, Yukon, Northwest Territories, and Nunavut.

The WCCRE facilitates catechist formation in a variety of ways: by sharing vision and objectives among dioceses and eparchies, as well as views on specific topics such as the RCIA, youth ministry, and so on. The WCCRE attends to the formation of catechists at all levels: those working with adults, youth, children, family, seniors, and with special situations, mentalities and environments (see GDC, Part 4, Chapter III).

The WCCRE brings together for common benefit the experiences, undertakings and resources of the participants (see GDC, 268) in order to facilitate:

- Personal growth in faith
- Continuing education
- Exchange of ideas and resources
- Mutual support and sharing
- Cooperation to deal with common concerns related to catechesis in western and northern Canada.

The WCCRE communicates with the National Office of Religious Education (NORE), with the Assembly of Western Catholic Bishops (AWCB), and the Ukrainian Catholic National Catechetical Commission (UCNCC).

Dr. Joanne Chafe

Joanne Chafe worked for 35 years with the National Office of Religious Education (NORE) of the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops (CCCB). Since December 2000, she was the Director of NORE and Secretary of the English Sector Episcopal Commission for Catechesis (formerly the Commission for Christian Education). First working as a religious education coordinator with the Roman Catholic School Board in St. John's, Newfoundland, Joanne joined NORE in 1977. She held a master's degree in education with a specialization in religious education from Boston College, a master's in theological studies from the Atlantic School of Theology, and a doctorate in adult and continuing education from Columbia University. Joanne was passionately committed to adult learning and adult faith. Her experience, giftedness and passion were recognized worldwide. She tirelessly carried on the work of NORE and continued to support the Canadian bishops in their work around catechesis. Joanne was a great mentor to catechists across Canada and abroad—she consistently affirmed their good works and guided them to continuous creativity and excellence. She will be greatly missed.

At the invitation of the Holy See, Joanne attended the October 1997 International Congress in Rome for the promulgation of the revised General Directory for Catechesis. During her time at NORE, she served as President of the Religious Education Association of the United States and Canada and as President of the International Forum on Adult Religious Education.

Joanne died in Ottawa on February 17, 2012, at the age of 60.
