

# The Season of Lent

The season of prayer and penance to prepare for the feast of the Resurrection begins on Ash Wednesday, March 6. Originally the period of fasting in preparation for Easter did not exceed two or three days, but by the time of the Council of Nicaea in AD 325 forty days were customary. This length of time is associated with Christ's forty-day fast in the desert before beginning His public life (Matthew 4:1-2) and also recalls the forty years Israel spent in the desert after

the Exodus from Egypt (Numbers 14:34).

Lent has a twofold purpose: it is the last stage of preparation of Catechumens for Baptism, Confirmation and Holy Communion at the Easter Vigil and it prepares all of us to renew our baptismal promises at Easter.

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are universal days of penance. On these days those who are 14 years of age and older are bound to abstain from meat and those from 18 to 59 years of age should also fast, limiting their food to not more than one regular meal and two lighter snacks.

Besides fast and abstinence on specified days, the whole Lenten season should be penitential, with stress on prayer, reception of the Sacraments, especially Penance and Reconciliation, almsgiving and the practice of charity.

# **DIOCESAN OFFICES AND DRC RELOCATING**

Bishop Stephen Jensen announced that the Diocese of Prince George has accepted an offer to purchase the property on Southridge Avenue currently occupied by the Diocesan Pastoral Centre and the Domano Renewal Centre. The offer, which is subject to a number of conditions from the diocese and the purchaser, will take several months to complete.

After 17 years in its "temporary" location, the diocese will move its offices to leased space and then complete a process of planning to build a new facility for offices, conference and retreat space. The diocese owns properties in the city which would be suitable sites. We want to be good stewards of our financial resources to provide the right facilities to serve our evangelizing mission for decades to come.

There are many questions about how this future will unfold. We are only at the start of a lengthy process and further information will be shared as it becomes available.
