This year's guest speaker is Bishop Gary Gordon from the Diocese of Victoria.



Since his ordination, Bishop Gary's love of nature and connecting with his congregation, especially with First Nations communities, developed a lifelong bond with the Stó:lō Nation. Embodying the model to *Authentically Witness Excellence*, his adventurous, outgoing spirit, and gift of storytelling endeared him to the community. Shortly after being appointed Bishop of the Diocese of Whitehorse in 2006, in honour of his evangelising and connecting with the people, Bishop Gordon received the name *Xyolhmetoxw*, which means 'taking care of the people' in Halq'eméylem, the language of the Stó:lō Nation.

1. CENTER FOR APPLIED RESEARCH IN THE APOSTOLATE'S (CARA) SURVEY OF THE ORDINATION CLASS OF 2019

According to the Center for Applied Research in the Apostolate's (CARA) survey of the Ordination Class of 2019, <u>encouragement and accompaniment are key to fostering priestly vocations.</u> Of all responding ordinands, 92% reported being encouraged to consider the priesthood by someone in their life, giving credit to an average of four individuals for influencing their vocation. <u>A majority</u> <u>of respondents (69%) stated that</u> <u>their parish priest</u> was a key figure in their discernment process. Support from friends (43%) and fellow parishioners (39%) also had considerable impact. The ordinands also cited parents, other family members, teachers/catechists, school chaplains and campus/youth ministers as having contributed to their discernment of a priestly vocation.
