For this reason, there needs to be a renewed commitment on the part of the whole Church to provide young people in particular with opportunities for listening and discernment. There is a need for a youth ministry and a vocational promotion that can open the way to discovering God's plan, above all through prayer, meditation on God's word, eucharistic adoration and spiritual accompaniment.

On this World Day of Prayer for Vocations, let us join in prayer and ask the Lord to help us discover his plan of love for our lives, and to grant us the courage to walk in the path that, from the beginning, he has chosen for each of us.

THE DOMINICAN SISTERS OF NASHVILLE

In the U.S., the Dominican Sisters has grown by 110 sisters in 10 years, with 12

to 15 new nuns joining each year, according to Catholic World Report. Another, in Ann Arbor, Mich., was founded in 1997 with four sisters and had 96 last year.

In the Vancouver Archdiocese, two other orders of nuns have moved into the Lower Mainland this year: three Carmelite Missionary Sisters of St. Thérèse in Abbotsford, and five Dominican Sisters of St. Cecilia in Port Coquitlam.
