



Fr Terry Brock's Pilgrimage to Our Lady of Kibeho Mother of the Word, Rwanda Nov. 22-Dec. 02, 2019



A group of 28 pilgrims, most from the continent of America, a few from Africa and Asia, arrived on Sunday, November 22, 2019 in Kigali, Rwanda.

The Shrine of our Lady of Kibeho in Rwanda is growing in popularity. A basilica is at the conceptual stage of development, and a 60 million dollar road to Kibeho is also being built.

In contrast to other shrines like our Lady of Guadalupe, which drew 10 million pilgrims, our Lady of Kibeho drew 30K on November 28, its feast day. This pilgrimage is still in its infancy.

The apparitions took place 1981-84. It is the only apparition on the continent of Africa that is approved by the church, as Guadalupe is the only one approved by the church on the continent of America.

Why go to Africa? Because the Blessed Virgin Mary invites us to go and she prophesied that millions would go there. (I am one of those) It's a good place to go to learn forgiveness and love of neighbor.

Rwanda suffered a terrible genocide in 1994, which the Blessed mother warned them of in her apparitions. Perhaps other genocide's are coming on the horizon, perhaps toward Christianity who knows. I would say, in short, that it is a very good place to go to pray to Our Lady. Personally, I sense in my heart and soul, that a renewed devotion has taken root in my life. I would say this is the fruit of my Marian pilgrimage to the Shrine of our Lady of Kibeho.

People go to all-inclusive resorts all the time without even batting an eye, why not go to a Marian Pilgrimage instead and fill your soul to overflowing?

It is also a very good place to go to see a young church, a very young church, and a very vibrant church!
