A Change to the Conclusion of the Collect Prayer

Following a request from the Congregation for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments which was sent to the Bishops' Conferences of all English-speaking countries, the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops agreed to adjust the English-language wording to the conclusion of the *Collect* (the opening prayer) in the *Roman Missal* as approved for use in Canada. As of Ash Wednesday, 17 February 2021, the word "one" is to be omitted from the conclusion of the Collect, and likewise of similar prayers in the liturgy (for example, the Blessing of Water at the Easter Vigil). Instead of ending "one God, for ever and ever", the Collect will now end "God, for ever and ever".

Until now, the word "one" has been used in the conclusion to the Collect in both the earlier and the current English-language translations of the Roman Missal. However, in consultation with the International Commission on English in the Liturgy, the Bishops of English-speaking countries are in the process of deciding when and how each country will implement this change. The reason for it is to avoid possible misunderstandings about the identity of the Son within the Blessed Trinity, or even the misconception that Our Lord Jesus Christ is "one God" among others.

With this change, the English will now also be consistent with the Latin text, as well as conform with translations into other European languages, including French. The new wording, which amends the English-language translations of n. 54 of the *General Instruction of the Roman Missal*, will be incorporated into all future editions of liturgical books approved for use in Canada.



NET Food Donation Invite – Diocesan Wide

This invite is for all parishioners and community members who have one of the eight Catholic Schools (CISPG) located in your community!

The National Evangelization Team (NET) – a team of seven Catholic young adults who have given this year of their lives to spread the Gospel to young people in our Diocese – are residing at the Domano Renewal Centre, located in Prince George. They are providing ministry to the 8 Diocesan Schools: in- person ministry in Prince George by invitation, and online ministry to the other five schools located across the Diocese. We are hopeful the NET Team can begin in-person ministry to the remaining five schools, when God willing, restrictions begin to lift in the Spring.

Under "normal" circumstances, the seven-member NET Team would be billeted in homestays and have meals provided by host families. Due to COVID, they have made the Domano Renewal Centre their home-base, yet are still in need of food. Here are some different ways you can give:

- Homecooked meals: These meals, which can be frozen and then re-heated, can be any size, amounts can range from feeding 2 team members, or all 7 and anywhere in between. Meals can be lasagna, cabbage rolls, casseroles, shepherd's pie or your favorite family dish!)
- Groceries: Such as bread, milk, rice, frozen meat, frozen veggies, or dried/canned foods.
- Gift-cards: To grocery stores such as Walmart, Costco and Superstore, as well as fast foods restaurants such as Subway, A&W, McDonalds, Pizza places etc. These donations can be for any dollar amount.

Those located in, and those who are visiting or passing through Prince George, can drop off these donations with Lisa or Laurie at the Pastoral Centre from Monday to Friday, 9am-4:30pm.
