A message from the Bishop



The COVID-19 pandemic that disrupted our lives on so many levels shows some signs of winding down, but its effects are far from over. Parish and mission communities are still very much in recovery mode. These times remind us how

much we depend on each other to ensure our mission as Catholics can continue.

It was wonderful to see that many parishes that surpassed their Appeal goal last year chose to forego their rebate and asked that the funds be given to small parishes and missions that were in need. This is a true example of Christian stewardship: giving back to God out of gratitude for His blessings.

This year's parish goals for the Appeal remain at a much-reduced level. As in last year, this is to ensure that the basic needs of smaller faith communities and missions are met, and that diocesan support can be maintained for things like youth and young adult ministry and tuition support for the neediest families in our schools.

Something that has changed from last year's Appeal is the news about graves at some residential school sites.

This tragic news reopened many wounds and reminds us that healing and

reconciliation within indigenous communities and with the wider Canadian society is a still unfinished work. To help advance that agenda, the bishops of BC agreed that each diocese would undertake to raise funds in a Fall campaign in support of reconciliation efforts. Ongoing consultation with aboriginal persons will help to determine how the proceeds should be used.


