

2021-2022 Diocesan Annual Appeal and Healing and Reconciliation Appeal

We have completed the active phase of Called Together 2021-22 and are currently sitting at 37.54% of the overall diocesan goal of \$200,000 totalling \$75,071 with \$51,831 already collected. The current Appeal Update report is attached.

To date, no parish has hit 100% of their parish goal, but Annunciation Parish in Prince Rupert and St. Patrick's in McBride are nearly there at around 85% of their goals. We haven't received all of the donation reports, so totals may be higher.

This year, as last year, the majority of our funds collected are allocated to support the smaller parishes and missions of the diocese especially as they have met more significant obstacles due to COVID.

In addition, we are concurrently raising funds for the B.C. Bishops' appeal in support of healing and reconciliation, which is designed to support specific efforts to promote reconciliation between indigenous and non-indigenous peoples in our communities. We are currently at \$16,900 pledged with \$11,470 already collected.

Thank you to everyone for your generous support. Please continue to pray for the needs of our diocese.

Statement of Apology to Indigenous People of this Land from the Catholic Bishops of Canada:

Please post the following in your Sunday Bulletin:

On September 24 the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops issued a statement of Apology to the indigenous Peoples of this land. The Bishops affirmed and acknowledged to the Indigenous Peoples the suffering experienced in Canada's Indian Residential Schools as well as the historical and ongoing trauma faced by Indigenous Peoples to this day. Along with those Catholic entities which were directly involved in the operation of the schools, the Catholic Bishops of Canada expressed their profound remorse and apologized unequivocally.

Together with the many pastoral initiatives already underway in dioceses across the country, the Bishops pledged to undertake fundraising nationwide to support initiatives discerned locally with Indigenous partners. They also committed to continue to the work of providing documentation or records that will assist in the memorialization of those buried in unmarked graves.

A delegation of Indigenous survivors, Elders/knowledge keepers, and youth will meet with the Holy Father in December 2021 and discern with Pope Francis how best to proceed together on the pathway of hope and renewal in the coming years.

The Bishops of Canada are committed to continue the journey of healing and reconciliation with the First Nations, Metis and Inuit Peoples of this land. For more information, please contact the diocese or visit www.cccb.ca



National Healing and Reconcilation Financial Pledge:

The Bishops of Canada, as a tangible expression of their commitment to walk with the Indigenous Peoples of this land along the pathway of hope, are making a nation-wide collective financial commitment to support healing and reconciliation initiatives for residential school survivors, their families, and their communities.

With a target of \$30 Million over up to five years this will include initiatives in every region of the country. The commitment will be achieved at the local level, with parishes across Canada being encouraged to participate. The Diocese of Prince George is grateful for the donations that have already been made to this year's Healing and Reconciliation Appeal and any further initiatives by the Diocese will be announced in the future.
