## Called Together and Healing and Reconciliation Appeals Update

I am pleased to report that we have exceeded 82% of our diocesan goal, with over 76% already received. This will mean that three-quarters of our funding goal will be distributed to the smaller parishes, missions and ministries throughout the diocese early in the new year. In addition to that, around \$73,000 will be paid back to parishes who have exceeded their parish goals.

I'm also very pleased to report that over \$37,000 has been pledged to the Healing and Reconciliation Appeal, with over \$33,000 already received. Thank you for your generosity.

I have been delighted to see more parishes reach their parish goal.

Christ Our Saviour Parish (PG) managed to cross 101% of its target and Immaculate Conception Parish (PG) reached 105% with almost all of it already received. They will start to earn rebates to be sent back to their parishes.

We've also seen a number of parishes make good progress and getting closer to their parish goals: Sacred Heart Parish (Terrace) is almost at 96%, Notre Dame Parish (Dawson Creek) had a 12% rise to over 80% of its goal, Christ the King Parish (Kitimat) had a big jump of 25% to reach 77%, St. Andrew's Parish (Fraser Lake) saw a 16% increase to hit 71%, and St. Mary's Parish (New Hazelton) jumped more than 28% to over 50% of its goal. Well done!

Some other parishes continue to add to their totals, providing additional funds for parish projects from Appeal rebates: Annunciation Parish (Prince Rupert) increased to nearly 400% of its parish goal and St. Joseph's Parish (Vanderhoof) added another 32% to hit 162% of its goal.

On behalf of those small parishes, missions and ministries throughout the diocese, I want to thank everyone for your continued support of our appeals. Many parts of our diocese rely on these funds to help with their ministry. Your contributions -- both financial and spiritual -- are an important sign of our unity in Christ. Please continue to pray for the needs of the entire diocese. We still have work to do!

This will be the last update until the new year.



# Burying the Dead, Grieving Well – a Guide for Catholics on Bodily Disposition and Grief from the Episcopal Commission for Doctrine

The Episcopal Commission for Doctrine has released a document called "Burying the Dead, Grieving Well: A Guide for Catholics on Bodily Disposition and Grief."

Today, Canadians are presented with the choice of numerous methods of bodily disposition. In this document, the Catholic Bishops of Canada are proposing to the faithful and to all people of good will a reflection on the way we treat the bodies of the deceased and live out our grief when faced with the death of a loved one. It is intended to help Catholics better understand the different options available and the way each



relates to the natural process of bereavement and grieving, as well as serves as a guide to the Catholic liturgical and pastoral practices that accompany the grieving process. The Bishops hope it will be useful for families and friends dealing with the loss of a loved one, for pastors and those who welcome and accompany the bereaved, as well as for those in the funeral industry who take the religious dimension into account.

## Fake Email Messages from the Bishop and Clergy of the Diocese

There have been reports from people receiving emails and text messages pretending to be sent by priests or the bishop and requesting assistance of some kind. Please DO NOT respond. Emails from the bishop would come from pgdiocese.bc.ca or pgdiocese.ca. While most fake messages have been from gmail.com accounts, there have been rare reports of some fake emails imitating legitimate email accounts.

Our advisors have told us that there are no steps we can take to prevent these messages from being sent. All we can do is advise everyone of the problem. If you receive an unexpected email claiming to be from the Bishop, Clergy, or any religious in the diocese and are not certain if it is legitimate, please call the Diocesan Pastoral Centre at 250-964-4424 or forward the email to the Pastoral Centre at reception@pgdiocese.bc.ca.

### Aid to the Church in Need's 2022 Christmas Campaign




The support from ACN enables Christians in Syria and Lebanon to remain on their ancestral lands, which are the historic homes of the first Christian communities.

In Syria, 90% of the population is living below the poverty line. In Lebanon, 70% of the population is living below the poverty line.
