Called Together and Healing and Reconciliation Appeal Update

I am pleased to report that we have reached nearly 87% pledged toward our diocesan goal and almost 82% already received; we have also surpassed \$39,000 pledged for the Healing and Reconciliation Appeal with over \$36,000 received.

Parish rebates have surpassed \$82,000 through pledges received and these funds will be distributed over the next few weeks.

Three parishes have met their respective goals since our last report on December 14th -- each of them with huge increases: St. Andrew's Parish in Fraser Lake jumped 31% to reach almost 103%, St. Mary's Parish in New Hazelton more than doubled their previous amount, adding 61% to reach nearly 112%, and St. Peter's Parish in Mackenzie almost tripled their total by adding 78% to reach more than 120% of their parish goal. Well done!

Two other parishes climbed closer to their goals and are almost there: Christ the King Parish in Kitimat added 8% to hit 85% of their goal and Notre Dame Parish in Dawson Creek added another 10% to hit nearly 91% of their goal. St. Joseph's Parish in Vanderhoof added 12% to get to 174% of their total and Sacred Heart Cathedral added another 22% of their goal to get to 169%.

We can and should celebrate these achievements, but we also need to remember that the Appeal contributions we have received are still nearly 20% short of our diocesan goal. That means that our smaller parishes, missions and ministries will only receive 82% of the funding they need. We would ask that you continue to keep the needs of these communities -- and those of the entire diocese -- in your prayers. We appreciate your participation in supporting these needs, both financially and spiritually, and ask for your continued assistance.

Shepherd's Corner Needs Volunteers

Shepherd's Corner is a ministry and outreach of the Diocese. Our purpose is to be a Christ-like presence in the downtown amongst homeless and street people. Because of the onslaught of Covid 19, we have been unable to invite people inside. This situation continues due to ongoing uncertainty, even though many restrictions in respect of Covid 19 have been relaxed. However, we are still able to provide (at our front door) services of drinks, snacks, clothing (when available) along with the warmth and presence of Jesus. We are open Monday to Friday from 10:00 A.M. to 1:00 P.M.

We are very thinly staffed and are in dire need of volunteers.

As Catholics, Shepherd's Corner allows us an opportunity to do as Jesus asked us in Matthew 25: 35 - 40. One does not need to be an expert in matters of homeless people. What is important is that volunteers try to see that those people who come to our door are children of God. From a safety perspective, as noted above, we do not let people in, but serve them at the door, and we have strict procedures in place to ensure cleanliness and high standards of hygiene. In addition, all volunteers are required to arrange for a criminal record check, which can be arranged for on the website of the Diocese. Thus, steps are taken to try to help volunteers feel safe.

Pastoral Care Training Sessions

Participants who attend all sessions will receive a Certificate of Completion. Participants will require a phone number and email address, a computer, tablet or smartphone with speakers, microphone and webcam, a reliable Internet connection and access to Zoom.

Whether you are a member of your parish Pastoral Care Team, an Extraordinary Minister of Communion, a member of the Knights of Columbus, CWL or St. Vincent de Paul, clergy or religious, caring for a family member, or someone attending as a personal undertaking, this training program is important. It will show why those who visit the sick are unique and how they can offer more than a friendly visit – they can be the hands and face of Christ to others. Bishop Gary Gordon of the Diocese of Victoria feels "it is important to have parishioners trained at the ready to provide a caring and compassionate experience to those who are most in need."
