Site Development in Vanderhoof

Site development has been an ongoing project of the congregation of St. Joseph's Parish in Vanderhoof for the last ten years.

During the time that Fr. Doug was pastor from 2010 to 2014, there was a serious effort to realize the dream of having a Gathering Room with kitchen facilities for parishioners to enjoy after-Mass coffee and treats together. The Gathering Room was created successfully and is used extensively by the Parish to this day. The Rectory was also given a facelift the same year, and, though much of the work was contracted, volunteers chipped in where they were able, including with the installation of the kitchen cupboards and wood flooring.

Fr. Rene Antonio was the pastor of Vanderhoof from 2014 to 2016 and oversaw the renovation of the sanctuary of the Church in preparations for the 50th anniversary for September 2017. The renovations shifted the tabernacle to the centre of the sanctuary's back wall, where it is now highlighted by the additional lights and panelling which have helped make the sanctuary brighter.

With Fr. Pier Pandolfo's arrival in 2017, the need to address the use of the old school building became paramount. The Parish was able to negotiate a long-term contract with Carrier Sekani Services for running a HeadStart program, which allowed the parish to begin the process of repurposing the building, including renovations to make the old space suitable for new uses. The process has been an exciting one for the parish and has brought them the interest of the local artist community. Beautifying and renovating the building has been a mixture of professional and volunteer efforts.

More recently, generous donors and volunteers have made further projects within the Church building possible, for which the Parish and Fr. Pier are immensely grateful. A project to build and install kneelers in the church pews was recently completed, and book holders for the pews are now in the works. The parish will also be upgrading its "Parish Tree" bulletin, which is where a large tree painting (4X8) will be home to photos of the parishioners.

A Tale of Prince Rupert and Haida Gwaii

On Ash Wednesday, I travelled to Haida Gwaii For a funeral of a 98-year-old ten days shy of 99 years old woman from Masset. Eight years ago she said to me "I've been praying for a priest to come here for many years" and I told her that I would be committed to this mission every month. Until Covid came, I was faithful to that.

I celebrated Ash Wednesday Mass in the morning and then I headed over to the



island via float plane. My plan was to return Friday morning. There is a saying, "if you want to make the Lord smile just tell Him your plans for tomorrow." So, the Lord had other plans for me as I was stuck on the island. This allowed me to celebrate Sunday mass for four people. The picture of the snow in front of Annunciation Church shows that there was a big storm when I was away and consequently parishioners would have had a hard time parking and therefore would not be coming to Mass in Prince Rupert. It seems to me that the Lord



who sees everything planned it accordingly. So, I was able to celebrate Mass with the parishioners on the island Haida Gwaii. A Family from Columbia recently took up residence in Port Clement about 50 km south of Masset but because of the road conditions were unable to join us for the service.

The funeral drew about 200 people, 75% were Mennonites. There's a Mennonite connection in the family and consequently they came as far as Burns Lake for this service. I must say I was very impressed with the children and the joy and the strength of the young men who filled in the grave at the graveyard on a very, very cold and windy day. The wind coming off the ocean, made it extremely cold somebody said it was -16. I can attest to that, because I found it very cold, and I was bundled up.
