

Called Together and Healing and Reconciliation Appeal Update

I am grateful to everyone who has participated to date in our appeals. We are now just over 63% of the way to our diocesan goal in pledges and almost 53% already received. We also have reached more than \$18,000 in our Healing and Reconciliation Appeal with all funds received.

St. Mary's (PG) has hit 66.88% of their combined goal, and Annunciation Parish is right behind with 66.37% of their combined goal. Sacred Heart Cathedral is at 59.31% and St. Patrick's is at 57.85%. We have several parishes already in the 40-50% range.

I want to remind everyone that the appeal is supposed to help everyone in the diocese. Our combined goals set this year reflect this by combining the diocesan goal with a parish goal. All funds raised above the diocesan goal are returned in full to each parish for their projects.

A lot of our smaller parishes and missions rely on this support from across the diocese in order to help keep everything running. At this point, we can only fund half (53%) of the amounts allocated to them. If you haven't yet contributed to the appeal, I would ask that you consider supporting the work of these parishes and missions.

Again, I ask that everyone continue to keep the many needs of the entire diocese in your prayers, especially at Mass. Your continued support, both financially and spiritually, is both greatly needed and appreciated.

Night Two: Dr. Thomas Bouchard on supporting families through perinatal palliative care

Dr. Thomas Bouchard, a family medicine practitioner in Calgary, will discuss his own experiences accompanying families through perinatal palliative care and Perinatal Hospice. The term "Perinatal Hospice" was coined by Dr. Byron Calhoun and is a "model of care that incorporates the strengths of prenatal diagnosis, perinatal grief management, and hospice care to address the needs of families."

"I started the family physician navigator program in Calgary," explains Dr. Bouchard, "to help guide couples through a difficult pregnancy journey when the interpretation of consults from obstetricians, neonatologists and other specialists can be overwhelming."

In this lecture, Dr. Bouchard will share stories and images from the families he has supported in Perinatal Hospice care — highlighting the guiding role of a family doctor and reminding us all of the beauty of a life, no matter how short.

"A new child is miraculous, even if they may have a short life. When love and life are concentrated in a short timeline of life, there are often more intense emotions and opportunities for deep transformation and hope, even in what seems like very dark moments."
