#### Called Together and Healing and Reconciliation Appeal

I don't have much to report this week, as we only saw some incremental updates in pledges received over the past seven days. We saw almost a 2.5% increase towards meeting our diocesan goal and no change in our Healing and Reconciliation appeal.

I am pleased to report, however, that St. Patrick's Parish in McBride had a tremendous jump of 32% to reach their total combined goal, surpassing 108%. Very well done!

Christ Our Saviour Parish in Prince George had a significant increase of more than 15%, reaching 57% of their total combined goal. Immaculate Conception Parish in Prince George added 6% to their total, getting to more than 63% of their goal. St. Andrew's in Fraser Lake added 4% to reach nearly 39% of their goal.

I want to encourage you to remember our smaller parishes, missions and ministries throughout the diocese—especially during this Advent season. Many rely on the funds provided through the appeal to help support their regular operations throughout the year. I would ask for your continued support—both financially and in prayer—for their many needs.

Donations received prior to January 1st will be issued a tax receipt for 2023 in late January or early February. Those received after December 31<sup>st</sup> will be issued a tax receipt in early 2025.

### O Antiphons at Immaculate Conception




