Called Together and Healing and Reconciliation Appeals Update

I am very pleased to report that we have crossed \$250,000 in total pledges and more than \$200,000 toward the diocesan goal. We have also added a bit more to the Healing and Reconciliation appeal with more than \$25,000 donated.

St. Peter's Parish in Mackenzie jumped more than 50% to reach 90.3% of its total combined goal. Well done!

Christ the King Parish in Kitimat added 5.5% to reach 40.74% of it total combined goal. St. Joseph's in Vanderhoof added another 5% to reach 57% of its goal, and Immaculate Conception Parish in Prince George made it to more than 69% of it goal.

Thank you to everyone who has contributed so far. We still have a ways to go to meet the many needs throughout the diocese. While the diocesan goal is to help support our smaller parishes, missions and ministries, each parish has its own project goal meant to help meet the needs of that parish. I would ask for your continued support both financially and in your prayers.

A Statement from the CCCB on the Non-Permissibility of MAiD in Health Organizations with a Catholic Identity

The Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops (CCCB) has released a statement regarding the non-permissibility of MAiD in Catholic Health organizations. "Euthanasia and assisted suicide (MAiD) have always been, and will always be, morally unacceptable because they are affronts to human dignity and violations of natural and divine law. Catholic healthcare affirms that every person, made in the image of God (cf. Gen 1:26), has intrinsic value, regardless of ability or health."

In their statement, they lay out the Catholic position of compassionate and high-quality palliative care, the timely access of which can reduce suffering and attend to patients' spiritual and psychological needs. The CCCB "oppose any efforts by governments or others to compel such facilities to perform MAiD in violation of Catholic teachings."

December 12 – National Day of Prayer in Solidarity with Indigenous Peoples

From the CCCB:

On 12 December, Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe, Patroness of the Americas, the Church in Canada celebrates the National Day of Prayer in Solidarity with Indigenous Peoples. This year, we take a moment to recall the Holy Father's Penitential Pilgrimage to Canada in July 2022, and in particular his words of prayer offered at Lac Ste. Anne:

"Lord, as the people on the shores of the Sea of Galilee were not afraid to cry out to you with their needs, so we come to you, Lord ... with whatever pain we bear within us. We bring to you our weariness and our struggles, the wounds of the violence suffered by Indigenous brothers and sisters. In this blessed place, where harmony and peace reign, we present to you the disharmony of our experiences, the terrible effects of colonization, the indelible pain of so many families, grandparents and children. Lord, help us to be healed of our wounds. We know, Lord, that this requires effort, care and concrete actions on our part; but we also know that we cannot do this alone. We rely on you and on the intercession of your mother and your grandmother. Yes, Lord, we entrust ourselves to the intercession of your mother and your grandmother, because mothers and grandmothers help to heal the wounds of our hearts."

2024 Call for Candidates for the Catholic Women's Leadership Program

We are pleased to announce that we are accepting applications for the 2024 cohort of our Leadership Program, scheduled to begin in June 2024 at the Providence School of Transformative Leadership and Spirituality, Saint Paul University, Ottawa.

The program is open to all Canadian Catholic women, from all walks of life who have a genuine interest in making a difference in their communities and places of work.

A candidate must be a Catholic woman, at least 21 years of age, demonstrate oral and written English language competencies, have a genuine desire to cultivate her gifts of leadership, and have made a previous contribution to her community in some capacity.

The Program is a 11-month Certificate program with an ongoing mentorship once the course work is completed. Throughout the Program, participants will be guided by professional facilitators from Saint Paul University. The Program is specifically designed to integrate faith and life, personal and professional leadership development. Spirituality and a Catholic faith perspective are the foundation of all activities; prayer and reflective practice are core elements integrated throughout the program.

At present the plan for 2024 of the Program will have an introductory get-to-know-you online module in June 2024; and a five-day intensive component in June 2024. This is scheduled to be through ZOOM, and you will be expected to be present. All other modules are online and consist of videos, readings, personal reflections, and discussion forums. The final face-to-face residency component is scheduled for June 2025 in Ottawa.





Sensory Friendly Mass at Christ Our Saviour

Christ Our Saviour will be hosting a sensory friendly Mass on Saturday, December 16th, at 4:30pm. Sensory-Friendly Mass is intended to welcome persons with neurodiversity and will include modifications such as lower lights, softer music, more succinct and literal Homilies, and visual aids. The most significant difference at a sensory friendly mass is the absence of stigma, and therefore, people are encouraged to come as they are, move around if needed, wear noise cancelling headphones, and bring any seating or soothing items necessary. These liturgies offer an opportunity to foster a culture of belonging and meaningful participation at our parish.

Everyone is invited to bring their dinner and join us in the hall immediately after Mass to eat and enjoy some fellowship.
