Called Together Diocesan Appeal Update

We are very happy to report that we are just short of 90% of our diocesan goal, having reached \$268,045 of our \$300,000 goal. Thank you to everyone who have donated to the appeal and to those who pray for its success.

We had a number of parishes meet and exceed their targets: St. Peter's in Mackenzie rocketed up 93% to reach 180% of its diocesan goal and surpassing its parish project goal. St. Mary's in New Hazelton met its goals, leaping more than 63% to reach 140% and has also met its parish project goal. Sacred Heart Cathedral has met its portion of the diocesan goal, with an increase of almost 37%, reaching 123% and also meeting its parish project goal. Immaculate Conception also crossed the threshold, jumping more than 30% since our last report and is sitting at 112% and is withing 6% of hitting its parish project goal as well. Congratulations to all of you!

Other parishes also had large increases: St. Patrick's, in McBride, added another 107% to their total, reaching 287%. St. Joseph's in Vanderhoof added another 66% to reach 173% and meeting their parish project goal. Annunciation hit 236% of its goal, adding 20%, St. Andrew's in Fraser Lake and St. Anthony's in Houston both added more than 19% to their goals. Sacred Heart Parish in Terrace added a solid 17% to their goal and are on the cusp of hitting their diocesan goal and earning rebates. Christ the King Parish in Kitimat was just behind them at almost 16% and reaching 91% of their goal. St. Mary's in Prince George added another 10% and Christ Our Saviour in Prince George added 4%. Resurrection Parish in Fort St. John and Notre Dame Parish in Dawson Creek also moved the needle adding to their totals.

Well done, all of you. We are grateful to see your continued support of our smaller parishes, missions and ministries. Please remember to keep in prayer all of the many needs we have throughout our diocese.

Letter to Parishioners Regarding Lawsuits

Proposed Restrictions on Religious Freedom – Bill C-9

The President of the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops, Most Rev. Pierre Goudreault, has written to Prime Minister Mark Carney and other members of government concerning an amendment to Canada's hate speech legislation.

The Liberal Party has made an agreement with the Bloc Québécois. In exchange for the BQ's support of Bill C-9, the Liberals will amend Section 319 (3) (b) of the *Criminal Code* to remove the religious exemption

clause, which provides an exemption against prosecution for hate speech “if, in good faith, the person expressed or attempted to establish by an argument an opinion on a religious subject or an opinion based on a belief in a religious text.”
